Professor Dr Ingrid Schneider is Professor of Political Science in the Department of Informatics at University of Hamburg, Germany. Her research fields are technology assessment, governance, law, economy, and ethics of IT on which she has published numerous publications. Since 1996, she has advised several institutions, including the European Parliament and the European Commission, and has acted as Board Member of various European Scientific Associations and Research Projects.

Current research projects are “PRODIGEES – Promoting Research on Digitalisation in Emerging Powers and Europe Towards Sustainable Development” (2020-2025, EU funded) and “Ethical, legal and social aspects of Intelligent Virtual Avatars in Health” (HIVAM). She has more than 100 publications under her credit.
